Subject: [Barber-schools] Update to face covering and social distancing requirements

Dear barbers, barber shops, and barber schools,

The governor has issued [Executive Order 215](#), which modifies some of the previous requirements for face coverings and social distancing. Under the executive order, **all** the previous capacity and gathering limits and social-distancing requirements and **most** of the mask requirements have been lifted. Below is some information:

- Fully vaccinated individuals (people who are at least two weeks beyond their final vaccine shot) do not have to wear masks indoors or outdoors or socially distance, with the following exceptions (most of which don't apply in the barber industry but are listed here for information purposes):
 - Public transportation;
 - Health-care settings (such as hospitals, doctor's offices, or nursing homes);
 - Correctional facilities; and
 - Homeless shelters.
 - Child care, children's day camps, and children's overnight camps
- Barbershops no longer need to require fully vaccinated individuals to wear masks or socially distance.
- Businesses may choose to continue to enforce masks requirements, if they wish.
- People who aren't fully vaccinated must continue to wear a mask and maintain social distancing.
- Local governments (counties or cities) may choose to enact stronger requirements, and your business will have to comply with those requirements. Please contact your local governments with any questions about their requirements.

I realize that you won't necessarily know who has or hasn't been vaccinated. Your business can decide how best to respond. Ideally, people will follow an honor system of wearing masks if they aren't fully vaccinated.
